- Separate garbage correctly, and put the garbage into designated bags before taking it to the center. Oversized garbage too large to fit into garbage bags, newspapers, magazines, miscellaneous paper and cardboard do not need to be put into garbage bags.
- Be sure to take proof of your residence in Higashihiroshima City (driver's license, and item of post addressed to you, etc.) with


Points to note regarding using the garbage processing centers:

- At the center, drive your vehicle (under 4 tons) on to the weighing machine, and show your identification at the weighing
- Follow the directions of the staff when unloading garbage. After unloading, drive your vehicle on to the weighing machine again.
- In the centers, there are large trucks moving around. Please be
- When taking garden (wood) waste, etc., to the Hiroshima-Chuo Ecopark, cut the wood into pieces shorter than 1m50cm (1m30cm for bamboo), and ensure that the wood is less than 20cm in
- Inquire at appropriate shops regarding items which cannot be disposed of at municipal facilities (televisions, fridges, washing machines, air conditioners, tires, agricultural implements, motorbikes, medicines/chemicals, fire extinguishers, etc.). These items will not be accepted at municipal facilities even if broken up.
- Construction waste and demolition waste from a business is industrial waste, and cannot be accepted.
