'Using blocks to think about disaster prevention'

These lectures are a chance for both Japanese and non-Japanese residents to think together about disaster prevention in a fun way. Participants will make use of blocks and hazard maps to think about what to do if a disaster occurs.

The lecture will be held twice, on Sunday September 25th and Sunday October 2nd, from 13:30 to 15:30. The content of the first and second lectures will be different. Both lectures will be held at Gota Community Center (11130-5, Goso, Saijo-cho, Higashihiroshima City, tel.: 082-425-0101).

The lectures will be in simple Japanese. The presenter can speak English, but you do not have to be able to speak English yourself.

The lectures are open to those living in Higashihiroshima City, irrespective of age or nationality. The limit for each lecture is 20 people. If there are more applications than available places, participants will be chosen by lottery.

The deadline for applications is Wednesday September 14th.

When you attend the lecture, please bring with you a drink, writing materials, and, if you have them, your Manabu-chan Notebook and your Lifelong Learning Passport. In addition, please wear a mask to help to prevent the spread of

COVID-19. Please be aware that the lecture may be canceled due to weather conditions or the spread of COVID-19.



Aqua Festa in Fukutomi


Fukutomi is the location of the source of the Nutagawa River, and this event is centred around the importance of water. On the outdoor stage, there will be various performances by children and cultural groups.

Special One-Off Payments to Households Exempt from Tax, etc. (for the 2022-23 financial year) ・非課税世帯などへの臨時特 別給付金(令和4年度分)

A Special One-Off Payment (of 100,000 yen per household) will be made to households exempt from resident tax, and to households whose income has dropped significantly as a result of COVID-19.

Payments will be made for one of the two following categories only, and households which received a one-off payment for the 2021-22 financial year are not eligible.

Payments to households exempt from resident tax:

The payment will be made to the head of the household, for households where all members are exempt from resident tax (the per-capita amount) from the 2022-23 financial year. The documents necessary for the application were sent to eligible households during July. If you believe you are eligible, but you have not received the documents, please contact the Higashihiroshima City Special One-Off Payments Enquiry Counter.

The deadline for applications is Wednesday November 30th (postal applications must arrive by this date).

Payments to households with sudden changes in finances:

The payment will be made to the head of the household, for households where income has decreased significantly during or since January 2022 as a result of COVID-19, to an extent that all members of the household would be eligible for exemption from resident tax.

When applying, please enclose with the application form a written declaration of your estimated income, a document showing the state of your income (a certificate of tax withheld, an end of year tax declaration certificate, a wage slip, etc.). Vaccinations against COVID-19

•新型コロナワクチンの接種

The fourth dose of vaccine against COVID-19 continues to be available. Vaccinations are available for those in the following categories, for whom five months have passed since their third vaccination: Those aged 60 or over;

Those aged between 18 and 59, with an underlying illness (please check the list of applicable underlying illnesses on the city website).

Vaccination coupons are being sent out to those aged 60 and over. It is not necessary to apply to receive a coupon for the vaccination. However, if you have moved to Higashihiroshima City from outside the city, then it will be necessary to apply.

For those aged between 18 and 59, with an underlying illness, it is necessary to apply to receive the vaccination coupon. If you require a vaccination coupon, please contact the City Call Center. Enquiries:

To make a reservation to receive the vaccination, or to request a coupon, please call the City Call Center on 0120-022-894. The Call Center is open from 8:30 to 20:00. Higashihiroshima Observatory Telescope 'Kanata' special observation • 東広島天文台「かなた望遠 event 鏡・特別観望会」

In this event, participants will be able to use the telescope 'Kanata' to observe the moon, Saturn and Jupiter, and watch a four-dimensional digital universe theater presentation.

The event will take place at Higashihiroshima Observatory, on Friday October 7th and Saturday October 8th, from 18:45 to 19:45.

The event is open to 50 people each day. If there are more applications than places available, participants will be decided by lottery. Groups can be up to five people. Groups formed only of elementary school students are not permitted, and children under school age cannot take part.

Car parking is available (one car for each group).

Deadline for payment of taxes: Friday September 30th

Please pay the National Health Insurance Premium (the third installment) by Friday September 30th. You can pay at convenience stores and by your smartphone (using PayB or PayPay).

A notice of non-payment (Tokusokujo, 督促状) will be sent to residents who have not paid their tax by the deadline. If you receive a Tokusokujo, please pay the tax immediately, using the payment slip enclosed.

Night-time and holiday hospitals

• Night-time and holiday duty hospitals: Full information about night-time and holiday duty hospitals within Higashihiroshima City is published in the Japanese-language version of the monthly city newsletter 'Higashihiroshima' (the page inside the back cover; only in Japanese), and on the Higashihiroshima City website (in Japanese and English). The information is subject to change at short notice, so before going to a medical facility, please be sure to call to confirm details.

Recently, there are more and more patients using emergency medical facilities at night and on holidays even though their situation is not serious. In some cases, these patients have prevented or delayed the treatment of patients with truly serious illnesses, and

additionally, such cases are one of the reasons for doctors becoming overworked. Emergency medical facilities open at night and on holidays are for patients with serious, emergency conditions. Please try to visit the medical facility you use normally, during opening hours on weekdays.

• Emergency medical treatment for children: Please call the advice line on #8000 (if you cannot get through on this number, please call 082-505-1399). The service is available every day between 19:00 and 8:00 the following morning. Also, advice is available on the website (you can access the website from the QR code to the right), in Japanese, English, and Chinese (simplified and traditional). You can obtain information about whether or not you should take your child to a medical facility outside of normal opening hours (at nights, on weekends or holidays, etc.).

• If you have a medical problem at night or on weekends, and you are unsure about whether or not you should go to a medical facility: Please call the Hiroshima area emergency consultation center on #7119. The service is free, and is available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. The staff will be able to give you advice on

whether to rest at home and see how symptoms develop, or whether you should go to a medical facility. If necessary, they can give you information about which facility to go to, or they can connect you directly to the 119 emergency service. In an emergency, do not hesitate to phone 119.

If you have a My Number Card, you can use it to obtain Certificates of Residence, etc., at convenience stores. Please be aware that it is necessary to make a reservation in advance if you wish to be issued with your My Number Card during an out-of-hours opening period.
